

League Information 2012



General:

- The Louisville Poker Society League (“League” hereafter) consists of ten (10) no limit Texas Hold’em tournaments, in which a player score is generated for each based on performance.
- The League, Main Event, and special events are for Full Members only. Junior Members may only participate in individual tournaments, as outlined in the Membership Agreement.
- Guests may participate in one (1) tournament per calendar year. Guest will not carry a score for their participation unless they become a member.
- A Full Member’s season score will be calculated based on their best six (6) individual tournament scores. There are a total of ten (10) league games; therefore up to four (4) bottom scores will be dropped when applicable.
- Full Members must play at least one event to qualify for the Main Event.
- If a Junior Member upgrades their membership, they will gain all points earned as a Junior Member.

Method of Scoring:

Tournament scores will be calculated as such:

- Part 1: Total Number of Players – RANK + 1

For example, with a 20 player tournament:

$$1^{\text{st}} \text{ place} = 20 - 1 + 1 = 20 \text{ points}$$

$$2^{\text{nd}} \text{ place} = 20 - 2 + 1 = 19 \text{ points}$$

$$3^{\text{rd}} \text{ place} = 20 - 3 + 1 = 18 \text{ points}$$

...

...

$$20^{\text{th}} \text{ place} = 20 - 20 + 1 = 1 \text{ point}$$

- Part 2: 1 point will be award for each knockout you make during tournament play.
- Part 3: 1st through 5th places will receive additional points, based on the following schedule:
 - 1st – 5 points
 - 2nd – 4 points
 - 3rd – 3 points
 - 4th – 2 points
 - 5th – 1 point
- Full Formula: The full equation for calculating score is $(P - R) + K + B + 1$ where:
 - P** is total players
 - R** is rank finished
 - K** is number of knockouts
 - B** is bonus for a top 5 finish.
- Scores will be posted to the StatsGenie.com website in a reasonable amount of time following each tournament. (Usually within minutes)
- The player with the top score after the 10th tournament (there are no points awarded for the Main Event) will be declared Player of the Year. Should there be a tie, highest number of knockouts will be used to determine a single winner.
- Winner of the Main Event will be declared Main Event Champion.
